My present growing crop of wheat all my farming utensils my stock of cattle, horses, mules, my goods & 35 head of hogs I inclose. To have and to hold the aforementioned property unto the said Joseph Mason his heirs Executors administrators & assigns so long upon condition nevertheless that this said John B. Barker his heirs shall retain possession of the aforesaid property until receipt of payment of the above sum or a sum thereof as may then be due and owing unto said Leland J. Mason their heirs executors & assigns of whom the said Leland Mason or either of them their heirs executors shall request the said John Mason to make sale of the property above mentioned as much as they think sufficient to satisfy the aforesaid debts and the amount estimated by the said trustee shall remain over of his death for his legal representation to act after giving reasonable public notice of the time and place of sale previous to sell to the highest bidder for cash the aforesaid property and all of the proceeds of such sale in the first place to pay and satisfy all reasonable calls attending the sale and their conveyances when paid and satisfy the aforesaid debts due to the said Leland J. Mason their heirs executors and to satisfy if any pay to the said John B. Barker his heirs executors and in testimony whereof the said parties have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year above written.
