This Indenture Made and Entered into this Twentieth day of October
Eighteen hundred and twenty between Bridgman Joyner and Jacob
Joyner of the one part and Anna Joyner of the other part Witnesseth
That the said Bridgman Joyner & Jacob Joyner for and in consideration
of Ten Dollars Current Money to them in hand paid by the said Anna
Joyner have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and
sell unto the said Anna Joyner all of their right title and in and to the
remainder in a certain parcel of Land being the one third part of the tract
left by Lewis Joyner at his death & assigned to his widow Lucy Joyner
as his legal dower in the lands left by the said Lewis Joyner the said
said Bridgman Joyner and Jacob Joyner being two of the heirs on whom
said dower estate well of right by virtue of the Law of descent pass
and descent at the death of the said Lewis Joyner. To have and to
hold the said remainder unto every other right & interest in the said
dower lands which will be the said Bridgman & Jacob Joyner descent
unto him the said Anna Joyner & heirs forever In Testimony whereof the
said Bridgman Joyner and Jacob Joyner have hereunto set their names
