This Indenture made this 3<sup>d</sup> February A.D. one thousand eight  
hundred and Forty four between Benjamin Travis of the first part and  
Thomas J. Dunnington trustee of the second part and Wyatt Hammonds of the  
third part. Whereas the said Benjamin Travis is justly indebted to the said  
Wyatt Hammonds in the sum of Sixty Eight dollars and thirty one cents  
and by him and demand the 25<sup>th</sup> day of Dec 1844. More fully appears  
whereas also with the legal interest thereon accruing the said Benj Travis is  
willing and desirous to sell Now This Indenture witnesseth that for  
and in consideration of the premises and all for the further consideration  
of one dollar of lawful Money of Virginia to the said Benjamin Travis in hand  
paid by the said Thomas J. Dunnington (trustee) at and before the bearing and  
delivery of these presents this receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by  
the said Benj Travis hath given granted bargained sold alienated enfeoffed  
released and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant Benjamin still  
alive enfeoff release and confirm to the said Thomas J. Dunnington  
(trustee) his heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of land  
lying and being in the County of Southampton in the State of Va  
Containing 201 acres 160 on the east side of Broadwood road and 40 on the  
west side of a road and bounded by the lands of John Kitchen Long  
Kitchen Wells Wellons Lamont Martins Strong Brothers and Edwards  
Travis and all and singular the appurtenances to the said tract or parcel  
of land belonging or in any wise appertaining and the right title and  
interest of the said Benj Travis in and to the said granted or intimated to  
be hereby granted tract or parcel of land and premises to have and to  
hold the said hereby granted tract or parcel of land and premises to the said Thomas J.  
Dunnington his heirs executors and assigns forever to the only purpose  
use and behoef of the said Thomas J. Dunnington his heirs executors and  
assigns forever and the said Benj Travis for himself his heirs executors  
and assigns and hereby Covenant promise and agree to and with the said Thomas J.  
Dunnington his heirs executors and assigns forever in Manner  
and forms following that is to say that the said Benj Travis his heirs executors  
and assigns forever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents  
the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises with their appurtenances bounded  
unto the said Thomas J. Dunnington his heirs executors and assigns against  
all persons whatever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents
