

This Indenture made the seventh day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three, between the said Leonard G. Cobb of the County of Bedford and state of North Carolina of the one part and Leonard G. Cobb of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of the other part; witnesseth by virtue of a deed of trust executed to the said G. F. Gurney & Co. by the said Leonard G. Cobb as trustee by Benjamin Whifford bearing date September 18<sup>th</sup> 1843 and duly recorded in the Clerk's office of Southampton County Virginia September 19<sup>th</sup> 1843 for the benefit of Abram Beaudet of Bedford City N.C. who will more fully appear by reference to said Deed of Trust the said G. F. Gurney & Co. being pursuant to their mandate from Abram Beaudet and the first payment of the said Benjamin Whifford after duly accounting according to the conditions of the said deed of trust did cause all the right title interest or claim in and to the tract of land known as the Whifford place due to contain two hundred and sixty four acres more or less and adjoining the lands of John & Greatis Doctor LaFayette Brown and others it being the tract or parcel of land conveyed by Benjamin Whifford to G. F. Gurney & Co. and put up at public sale on the premises on the seventh day of December 1843 at which time and place Abram Beaudet for Leonard G. Cobb became the highest bidder at the sum of one thousand dollars for the aforesaid tract of land (including the stile and Order Castle) with the appurtenances thereto belonging thereto.

This Indenture witnesseth that the said G. F. Gurney & Co. for and on consideration of the sum of one thousand dollars to have in hand paid by the said Leonard G. Cobb at and before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said G. F. Gurney & Co. trustees who hereby bargains sell alien conveys and confirm unto him the said Leonard G. Cobb his heirs and assigns forever all the aforesaid tract or parcel of land containing two hundred and sixty four acres more or less (aforesaid) with the appurtenances unto themselves thereto belonging with all rights title interest claim or demand of or unto the aforesaid tract or parcel of land with all and singular the hereditaments and emoluments to the same belonging or in any wise pertaining: To have and to hold to him the said Leonard G. Cobb his heirs heirs assigns forever in full and ample a manner as the said trustee is empowered by virtue of his trust aforesaid and further the said G. F. Gurney & Co. doth hereby covenant promise and grant to and unto the said Leonard G. Cobb his heirs and assigns who shall from time to time and at all times hereafter have held occupy possess or enjoy the aforesaid premises with the appurtenances free and clear of and from all encumbrances having done or committed by him the said G. F. Gurney & Co. (as trustee) or by his order means or procuring and the said trustee will warrant and defend the same to the said Leonard G. Cobb his heirs and assigns forever so far as the said G. F. Gurney & Co. (as trustee) is authorized by virtue of the aforesaid deed in trust and no further.
