 between Edwards Bells Commissioner under a decree of the Circuit Superior Court of
 Commissioners & Chancery for the County of Tewkesbury made on the 6th day of April 1842
 in a case then pending between Thomas B. Howell & Benjamin B. Howell and
 James Bells and plaintiff Maryand Wilson administrator of John Burgess and
 others defendants of the one part and Thomas B. Howell of the other part Witnesses
 that by the decree above referred to the said Edwards Bells was decreed to convey
 unto the said Thomas B. Howell the tract in the proceedings of the said court
 referred to that is to say the tract of land of which John Burgess was seized
 and possessed subject to the within answer: Now Therefore this Indentured
 Witnesses that the said Edwards Bells as well for and in compliance of the
 purposes as of the decree of the court to him by the said Thomas B. Howell and
 henceforth the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained
 sold & by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Thomas
 B. Howell his heirs and assigns the tract of land of which John Burgess
 was seized & possessed containing sixty acres More or less lying and being in
