Howell both to a Ord of Court - bearing date the 27 day of October 1783 by and between Edwin Master of the first part - the said William M. Howell trustee of the second part and Rachel Spencer of the third part - and Recorded in the Clerk's for the County of Southampton on the 30 day of October 1783 all of the County of Southampton of the first part and George B. W. Howson of the second part - whereas the said Land included in and conveyed by the said Ord of Court - above mentioned having been first up at public auction on the 16 Inst - and sold according to the Terms of said Ord and the said George B. W. Howson having become the purchaser for the sum of Three hundred and fifty one dollars Now This Indenture Witnesseth that in Consideration of the premises and for the further Satisfaction of the sum of three hundred and fifty one dollars by the said George B. W. Howson paid to the said Edwin Master as of receipt of which the said Edwin Master do hereby acknowledge the said William M. Howell and the said Edwin Master and his wife Louisa G. Master doth give grant bargain and sell unto the said George B. W. Howson the said tract of Land in the said Ord of Court - mentioned and thereunto ascribed together with all privileges and appurtenances in any manner thereto belonging to the said George B. W. Howson To Have and to hold to the said George B. W. Howson to him and his heirs forever and the said Edwin Master doth hereby covenant to and with the said George B. W. Howson to warrant and defend the title to the said tract of Land and appurtenances as aforesaid to the said George B. W. Howson's his heirs against the claims of himself and all persons claiming by or through him and against the claims of the other persons whatever and the said Edwin Master and his wife Louisa G. doth hereby covenant with the said George B. W. Howson to warrant and defend unto him the said George B. W. Howson his heirs and assigns to the said tract of Land and appurtenances as aforesaid to the said George B. W.
