Brown his heirs & assigns a certain tract or parcel of land situate lying & being in the County aforesaid containing by estimation fifty acres (or the same more or less) bounded as follows (viz) Beginning at a gum post or Stake Branch thence down the said branch to the cut-tail swamp the adjoining line between said land and Joshua Whitney's land thence down said cut-tail swamp to black water river thence down said river to @ (spring here standing) West the Margin of said river as the west or Southampton side this is a line betw. the above named tract and Geo. Brown's tract thence along a line of marked trees west course ending in Geo. Brown's line to the gum in the gum post the first station together with all rights the premises & reversions remaines & remainours great & little unto & for ever of the said Geo. Brown his heirs & assigns to hold the said fifty acres of land with the limits & inclosures to all & singular other the premises hereinafter mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of the rights & appurtenances unto the said Geo.
