This Indenture made and entered into the 31st day of May in the year 1846 between River Banker of the first part, Frederick Edwards of the second part and William J Schell of the third part all of the County of Southampton sheweth that the said River Banker is justly entitled unto the said William J Schell on the sum of three hundred and twelve dollars by bond bearing equal date with these presents and being writing and assented to draw the payment thereof with all interest which they assent thereon has agreed to convey the property herein after mentioned unto the said Frederick Edwards in trust to be sold for that purpose Now therefore this Indenture Witnesseth that River Banker for and in consideration of the premises as well as for the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Frederick Edwards the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold unto the said Frederick Edwards his heirs and assigns the following property to wit one certain tract or parcel of land in the County of Southampton containing by Estimation two hundred and thirty four and a fourth acres more or less being the tract of land on which the said Banker resides: one Negro Man named John two head of horses & six head of cattle and the increase of said horses & cattle which are and the property is conveyed in a deed of trust hereinafter recited by the said Banker to the said Edwards for the purpose of securing a certain debt due the said Schell and is also subject to that debt: also one bay colt & six head of cattle & six head of hogs one pig & one sheep & one cart & what soever further and furniture and all the household articles contents of every description plantations vineyard and all the former growing crops of corn cotton grass peas potatoes etc &c and one acre of land to have and to hold the above said property with the increase of the same cattle & hogs unto him the said Frederick Edwards his heirs & assigns forever: UPON TRUST Nevertheless that at any time during the life of the said River Banker shall make default in the payment of the aforesaid sum of three hundred & twelve dollars when the same shall be demanded by the said Schell his heirs etc it shall & may be lawful for the said Edwards being thereto required by the said Schell his heirs and assigns to make sale of the property herein before conveyed or retained to his executor and out of the moneys arising therefrom after paying the expenses of said sale & the conveyance pay and discharge the debt aforesaid due the said Schell with the interest which may be due thereon and the balance if any pay over to the said Banker: IN WITNESS whereof the said Banker Schell and Edwards have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and first before written
