St. George the other party Wiltshire that the said Berry Griffins as Commissioner of record in consideration of the sum of Four hundred and Thirty dollars of lawful money of the Commonwealth to have in hand paid or account to be paid by him at or before the making and delivery of these presents this receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold at public auction and by the forenamed booksale unto him A. St. George his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land, as above described containing one hundred and fifty acres to the same more or less and bounded as follows beginning at a point on a corner of James Drawing's houses and Drawing has a ditch on a corner of the property of Andrew & Robert S. Griffins houses and Griffins has a white oak on a corner on said Drawing's houses and Drawing has a fence running thither. Parsons was the nextmost western tract houses A. St. George has to the beginning together with all and singular the houses and houses therefrom buildings yards gardens orchards, meadows and water courses, fence, commestibles, advantages, impositions and appurtenances whatsoever to the said 150 acres of land belonging or pertaining to the sum or any part thereof more or less and present thereon 100 hours and to hold the said land with the boundaries hereinabove and all singular the forenamed houses before mentioned or intended to be exchanged and every fruit and fruit thereof with the said Abingdon A. St. George his heirs forever to use for the only purpose and no other of him the said Abingdon A. St. George his heirs and assigns forever and the said Berry Griffins as Commissioner of record for having the said land unto the said A. St. George and his heirs and assigns forever free from the claim of him the said Berry Griffins as Commissioner of record of his heirs and further shall not make and forever release by these presents.
