

short Note executed the 16 instant 1864 for the sum of Four Hundred and Five Dollars due and owing the 2 March to James Moore as debt for the 2 Thomas Pitt's note executed to Henry Williamson for four dollars bearing date the 15 May 1864 and on Demand the 26 April 1864 and the sum Thomas Pitt being anxious and willing to answer the said debt unto the 2 March to James as well as to cover him the said James having given his bond to Henry Moore for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to have and hold to Henry Moore at and before the making and delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged good bargained and sold and delivered by these presents grant bargains and sell unto the said Henry Moore his legal representatives & executors following: Property to and held by the said Thomas Pitt's wife of late former holder Mrs. Mary Pitt have the present year in the said marital home also stocks of dry goods and house hold and articles furniture consisting of beds and bedding and all other property owned by the said Thomas Pitt's wife which he is entitled of every description owing to him the said Pitts wife of this property who may have arisen by the freeuse act of the general assembly of Virginia unto him the said Henry Moore and his legal Representatives forever as the said Thomas Pitt's wife debts of the前述 mentioned and former defend the legal right and title to the aforesaid property and may put one fence stand against the claim of himself and every other person or persons whomsoever upon the following strict and conditions herewithto that the said Henry Moore shall suffer the said Thomas Pitt to remain quiet possession of the property and enjoy it until the 1<sup>st</sup> day of June 1865 and after it shall be lawful by the instructions of said Pitts for the said Henry Moore to give three days notice of his intent to sell at public sale at the present residence of the said Pitts wife to have the property freely removed or as much as will be sufficient to pay the debt and costs herein named to the 2 March to James as well as the amount debt to Henry Williamson as well as May 1864 there due and out of the proceeds of such sale first discharge all legal costs attorney's and the rate actually paid and satisfy this aforesaid debt fully account & intended to be account or as much as may be then due and lastly if any surplus shall remain from the sale of the property to the said Henry Moore shall pay over the same to the said Thomas Pitt or any person authorized by him to receive it.
