as property unto the said William W. Smith his heirs executors administrators & assigns &c
trust upon condition Newson's that the said David Newson his heirs or shall
return payment of the aforesaid property until default of payment of the above sum or as much
thereof as may then be due and owing unto the said William W. Smith his heirs executors
&c or whom the said Augustus H. Newell his heirs or assigns shall request the said
William W. Smith to make sale of the property above named or as much thereof as they
may think sufficient to satisfy the aforesaid debt and the accruing interest thereon he the said
trustee shall as in case of his death for his legal Representatives to sell after giving reasonable
public Notice of the time and place of sale present to all to the highest bidder for each the
aforesaid property and out of the proceeds of such sale in the first place to pay and satisfy
all Newson's debts attending the said and the sum of money so paid to the said
Augustus H. Newell indifferently or otherwise &c and the surplus if any to pay to the said
David Newson his heirs or executors for delivery whereof the said parties have hereunto

This Indenture made this 15 day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand
Eight hundred and forty three between G. S. Clark of the first part and Robert Roper of the
second part both of the town of Southampton one state of Virginia Whereas Johnson Paxford
on the 15 day of December 1842 in order to secure the payment of a certain sum of Money
to William S. Paxford did by instrument of trust of that date convey to the said G. S. Clark his
husband & certain tract or parcel of land bounded as follows, due expense attorney
fees, executors fees & legal expenses for the use and purpose in the said instrument mentioned,
and whereas the said debt aforesaid to be secured together with the legal interest thereon amounting
not having been paid off and discharged by the said Johnson Paxford his heirs or executors aforesaid
before the 12 day of December 1848 so that account of Payment was made and the said
