to travel my intent is that above amount and number of any who live here the said George
H. Knobell his Sureties administrators & executors forever against myself the said Robert W. Nickelsberg
and all executors or persons whatever doth witness acknowledge the said Robert W.
Nickelsberg hath warrants as he had a sufficient sum the 31st day of July 1864.

This Indenture made this ninth day of December in the year of our Lord One Thousand Phillip & Anne Boleyn, and his wife Lady to Elector of the County of Lancashire of the said first and Theodore Langdale of the County of Leicestershire of the other part witnesseth that the said Phillip & Anne Boleyn, and his wife afforseth for and on consideration of the sum of £100, thousand pounds of our money to them by the said Theodore Langdale in hand first paid unto him before that said brother died hereby acknowledge have granted bargained sold & covenanted and by these presents do grant bargaine sell a convey unto the said Theodore Langdale his heirs & assigns a certain tract or parcel of land containing 8.82 acres to the swan more or less being in Round Hall lying and lying in the County of Leicestershire in the said town of Melton Mowbray in the forest of land with the appurtenances thereto belonging to him the said Theodore Langdale his heirs and assigns to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land to the said Phillip & Anne Boleyn his wife Lady to Elector for themselves their heires & assignees & administrators to have command and power to let with the said Theodore Langdale his heirs and assigns that the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances thereto shall be sold by the said Theodore Langdale his heirs & assigns against these the said Phillip & Anne Boleyn his wife Lady to Elector for themselves their heires and assigns otherwise what and by whom these presents & for whom soever it is sold fully released this said Phillip & Anne Boleyn his wife Lady to Elector have beene at their hands and affors these presents this ninth day of December in the year above written
