This Indenture made and entered into this day of August, in the year of our Lord, Eighteen hundred and Sixty Four between Thomas Russell of the town of Litchfield and state of Connecticut of the one part and James Howell of the same town and state of the other parts. Witnessing that the said Thomas Russell has in consideration of his sum of Thirty Dollars, sumach Money of this Commonwealth, so sum in hand paid by the said James Howell at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the Right whereof is fully acknowledged, books printed, engraved and sold, and by these presents with great bargains and sell, with him the said James Howell his wife and assigns forever, one certain Piece or parcel of land situated in the town of Litchfield a parish of St. Lukes Containing by a full survey made by the said Howell three and three quarter acres being, two where said James Howell now resides and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a post a true tree corner for said Thomas Russell and James Howell line running along a road leading from the said house between them & the said post 8 rods S. 75 E. Post to a red oak tree 8 rods N. 25 E. to a black oak standing on east James Howell's land a red cedar tree 8 rods N. 25 E. along, and James Howell's land 10 rods N. 25 E. Post to a post with a cedar tree 8 rods E. 60 feet to the beginning, &c. Post and to hold the above described piece or parcel of land forever with all and singular its appurtenances thereto belonging, or in any wise appropriate unto him the said James Howell his wife and assigns forever to him and for the use of himself and his heirs the said James Howell his wife and assigns forever and that the said Thomas Russell for himself his wife, executors and assigns with his coverts and appurtenances and forever defend all the Rights and titles to the aforesaid piece or parcel of land and presents against the claims and demands of all and every other person or persons whatever the witnesseth that the said Thomas Russell books hereunder set his hand and affixed to seal the day and year first above written.
