Office of Southampton County Court, on the 16 day of March 1760 did come to the said Sheriff R Edwards a certain tract or parcel of land &c. being the said several tracts of land that day (the 26 February 1760) conveyed by the said JohnHello aforesaid to the said John St. Hovis his Trustee, and with full power & authority to the said Sheriff R Edwards to sell the said parcel of land &c. for the purpose of paying the said sum of Money at any time when the same required by the said Commissioner Gold his heirs & executors after the said sum of Money or any part thereof should become due: and Whereas the said sum of Money, having become due and the said John St. Hovis having failed to pay the same, the said Sheriff R Edwards by virtue of the power and authority aforesaid was herein by the aforesaid tract of lands being sold required by the said Commissioner Gold did after giving at least ten days Notice of the time and place of sale of the said houses, doors and other fixtures in the County & cause to take all possible measures to the highest bidder for bearing on the day of June 1760 in front of the Court houses door the before mentioned parcel of land &c. and at the sale so made the aforesaid because the purchaser of the said parcel of land by bidding therefor the sum of six hundred & sixty dollars which was the highest bid made for the same. Now therefore the said Sheriff R Edwards & John St. Hovis and Sarah St. Hovis his wife for and in consideration of the said sum of six hundred & sixty Dollars to the said Sheriff R Edwards in hand paid by the said SamuelHello the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained and sold by these presents to grant bargained & sold unto the said SamuelHello his heirs and assigns the parcel of land herein before mentioned and described (for a more particular description of the same reference may be had to the deed from Commissioner Gold to the said John St. Hovis bearing date 26 February 1760 & recorded to Record the 16 day of March 1760) To have and to hold the said parcel of land & premises with its appurtenances unto him the said SamuelHello his heirs and assigns against whom the said Sheriff R Edwards & John St. Hovis and Sarah St. Hovis his wife and all persons claiming the same or any part thereof by force through or under claim or either of them. And whereas we have the said Sheriff R Edwards & John St. Hovis and Sarah St. Hovis his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first before written.
