This Indenture made and entered into this 18 day of July in the Year 1844  
between Samuel P. Nicholson and Mary his wife of the first party William &  
Nicholas Schell of the second party and Robert Murray of the third party whences that said  
to Samuel P. Nicholson together with Wm. P. Parker, Nicholas M. Schell and Robert R.  
Murray his wife executed at Long Island to the aforesaid Robert Murray on the 18 day of  
July 1844 for the sum of two hundred and twenty dollars & thirty one cents with interest  
from the first day of January 1843 and whereas the said Samuel P. Nicholson is  
desirous to secure the payment of the aforesaid sum and interest to the aforesaid Robert  
Murray by conveying the property hereinafter mentioned unto the said William & Schell to  
be sold for that purpose. Now therefore this indenture witnesseth that the said Samuel  
P. Nicholson and Mary his wife for me considerations of the aforesaid amounts due by said Long to  
the said Robert Murray as well as for this further consideration of the sum of one dollar  
to them on hand paid by the said William & Schell (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged)  
have granted bargained & sold away enfeoffed & retained by their friends do great Long &  
will clear myself and myself unto the said William & Schell he has heretofore delivered  
unto me the following tract pieces or parcels of land lying in the County of  
Suffolk near the Town of Farmingdale that is to say one tract containing Ninety acres  
fourth acre more or less anchor containing forty six & half acre more or less anchor  
containing twenty one acre more or less anchor containing thirty acres more or less for or more  
particular descriptions of the said several tract pieces or parcels of land reference may be had  
to the Deeds now extant by Nicholas M. Schell & the other by Nicholas M. .... N.  
Schell to the said Samuel P. Nicholson both bearing date 18 day of July 1844 & admitted  
to record in the Clerk's Office of Suffolk County together with all & singular his  
privileges & appurtenances whatever to the said several tract pieces or parcels of land or either  
of them belonging or in any way appertaining. It is agreed to have the said several tract pieces  
or parcels of land with the foregoings & appurtenances whatever there belonging unto him  
the said William & Schell his heirs executors administrators & assigns forever upon the  
following terms & conditions that of the said Samuel P. Nicholson shall fail to pay
