delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold as follows  
date by virtue of an act of trust executed by John Moore to Jas. Simmonell and by them  
firstly he bargained and sold unto the said Allen Stephenson the house and all negroes & certain  
tools & part of land in the County of Southampton and land in the lands of Big Branch and  
Allen Stephenson containing by estimation one hundred acres to the same house & lot together with  
all and the necessary and convenient conveniences and improvements, gentry and other realty goods and  
furniture thereout and every part and parcel thereof £30 1000 and to hold the said lands or  
part of land of 100 acres to the same house & lot with the several encroachments and all and  
other parts of the premises herein before mentioned intended to be bargained and sold and every part  
and parcel thereof with every of their rights, tenures and appurtenances unto the said Allen  
Stephenson he have and assigns forever and the said Alfred J. Stephenson for himself and his
