This Indenture made and entered into this 18<sup>th</sup> day of July 1846 between James P. Nicholson  
 and Mary his wife of the first part; William G. Abbott of the second part; and William A. Spack  
 Nicholas M. Abbott, William M. Bennett of the third part; Whereas the said William A. Spack  
 Nicholas M. Abbott, William M. Bennett have become security for the said James P. Nicholson in so much  
 as Spack had executed to Nicholson a mortgage on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of July 1846 for the sum of three hundred & sixty dollars  
 they were each made abhors from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1849 also to the said Nicholas M. Abbott & William  
 Nicholson for the sum of one hundred & thirty seven dollars 77<sup>100</sup> Dollars out of them on demand  
 the 18<sup>th</sup> day of July 1845 another on demand the 18<sup>th</sup> day of July 1846 and the other on demand
