Whereas Benjamin W. Brill is indebted to Manning & Smith's Heirs & Heirs, he has been for & debt, due to Nathaniel Brannon of Hanover Co. Va. of Family, one hundred dollars due by bond bearing date December the first, 1842, with interest, from date due date and costs & certain date of trust, bearing date April 27, 1843, while said debt is duly recorded, in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County, page 852. Concerning to between Brannon as trustee chosen by himself & certain land, of land in said County containing by Estimation, two hundred and thirty three acres more or less bounded by the lands of John D. West, Thomas, Coll. the lands of the estate of William Brannon & James C. Brannon and others. The said principal Money and interest Brannon had been fully paid to the Attorney of Nathaniel Brannon on the 7 day of November 1844, and Elias Brill having become the purchaser of the said land, he is indebted now to Brannon and coming to him a perfect title thereto. What Brannon therefore, Brannon the 7 day of November 1844, delivered the said Benjamin W. Brill and Brannon Brannon and heirs of the first part, and Elias Brill of the second part, Witnesses that the said Benjamin W. Brill for and in consideration of the payments to the said Nathaniel Brannon of the said principal Money and interest, shown by the said Elias Brill before the County, and delivery of their presents the receipt, whereof is hereby acknowledged, and for the consideration of the sum of one dollar to him the said Brannon in hand paid before the County, and delivery thereof they the said parties of the first part, have bargained, given granted, and sold and by their presents do give grant, bargain sell and convey unto the said, Elias Brill his heirs and assigns all that certain tract, piece or parcel of land, situated and lying on the west side of Manning river containing two hundred and thirty three acres more or less, and boundaries whereof will fully appear by reference being had to the said deed of land, on record in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County. To Have and to Hold, the said piece or parcel of land and all and singular its buildings improvements and appurtenances of every kind, unto him the said Elias Brill and his heirs to the only proper use and behoof of her the said Elias Brill his heirs and assigns forever. In Testimony whereof the said Benjamin W. Brill the said Brannon have hereunto set their hands and seals the 5 day of November in the year 1844.
