This Indenture made this 21st day of January in the year Eighteen hundred and twenty five between John W. Diller of the first part, Robert Kidding of the second part, and James D. Peters of the third part, all of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia Whereas the said John W. Diller is justly indebted to the said James D. Peters in the sum of fifteen hundred dollars due and payable on the 21st day of January 1825 by bond bearing date on the same day and year, this payment, whereof the said John W. Diller is desirous to become And this Indenture witnesseth that, for and in consideration of the premises and for the further consideration of our Diller in hand paid by the said Robert Kidding the receipt, whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said John W. Diller and by these presents said Bingham sell and convey unto the said R. Kidding his heirs and assigns the following Negro Slaves to wit, James Dickie Emahiser, Naney Mary Beth Angeline Nephier and Harriett together with the future increase of the families To Have and to Hold to have the said R. Kidding his heirs and assigns forever With the said J. Diller for himself his heirs Executors and administrators due and owing with the said R. Kidding his heirs & assigns that the said John W. Diller well and his heirs Executors & administrators shall lawfully and defend the same to the said R. Kidding his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons whatsoever. UPON RECORD, Nevertheless that, the said R. Kidding his heirs and assigns shall forever the said Diller to remain in quiet, and personal possession of said Negro Slaves and remain their heirs lawful to be and use and defend the same on the payment of said sum of money on which it is in fact, and their upon the further bond that, the said R. Kidding shall and will as soon after the happening of such default of payment, as he shall be required by the said J. Diller his Executors administrators or assigns to do sell the said Slaves or such part thereof as shall be required for the purpose aforesaid to the highest bidder for ready money after public sale the time and place of sale at his own discretion and your County day before thereof in one or more Newspapers printed in the Town of Petersburg and also publish the same by advertisement, at the door of the Court House of the County or some court day previous to the day of sale and any of the proceeds of sale shall after satisfying the expenses thereof and all other expenses attending the execution of this indenture be paid to the said Peters his Executors administrators or assigns the whole amount and the interest thereon in such part thereof as may be due and the balance of any shall pay to the said Diller his heirs Executors and assigns. And if the value of the said debt, whereof shall be fully paid off & discharged to the said Peters his Executors before the 21st day of January 1825 so that the default of payment is made then this condition is to void, in the same as full force & effect as if the parties to these presents have bound themselves their heirs and assigns this day and year first above written.
