

This Indenture made the 3 day of February, 1725. on Thousand Eight,  
 hundred and forty five between James S. Williams of the County of Southampton of the  
 one part, and Margaret Williams and Kate Williams of the other part: Witnesseth that the  
 said James S. Williams for the sum of one hundred and ten dollars in hand paid by the  
 said Margaret Williams and Kate Williams whereby the said James S. Williams doth acknowledge  
 himself fully and amply satisfied, and paid and the said James S. Williams doth promise  
 his heirs or assigns bargain and sell unto the said Margaret Williams and Kate Williams one  
 certain tract or parcel of land and premises lying and being in the County of Southampton  
 containing by Metes and Bounds one acre more or less and bounded by the  
 boundaries by being the back of land formerly belong to George Camp: To Have and  
 hold the aforesaid land together with all its appurtenances with reserving the interest of  
 George Camp her life right, and the said James S. Williams hath purchased his heirs or  
 assigns sell unto the aforesaid Margaret Williams and Kate Williams and to their heirs  
 forever the aforesaid tract of land with all its appurtenances, and the aforesaid James  
 S. Williams doth by these presents warrant and forever defend all right title claim of  
 any person or persons claiming or demanding the same or any part thereof: And Witnesseth  
 thereof the said James S. Williams hath executed at his hand and seal the day and

This Indenture made and entered into the first day of February on Thousand  
 Eight hundred and forty five between George Booth of the first part, Ben J. Pope of the  
 second part, and Guttery D. Barham of the third part, all of the County of  
 Southampton and State of Virginia: Witnesseth that the said Guttery D. Barham is the said  
 Commonwealth, George Booth security to the said Ben J. Pope for Two hundred & Eighty five dollars  
 due and so demand the first day of July 1725 and the said George Booth being  
 well and discreet to witnamy the said Guttery D. Barham against and left in said  
 County: Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the  
 sum of one hundred and forty five dollars in hand paid by the said Ben J. Pope to the  
 said George Booth and for the further consideration of one dollar to have the said George Booth in hand  
 paid by the said Ben J. Pope do and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the  
 said George Booth receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged: but the said George Booth doth give grant  
 bargain and sell, and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell to the said  
 Ben J. Pope his heirs and assigns forever: One tract of land, on which the said George  
 Booth now resides together with its appurtenances (partly belonging to said George Booth  
 & partly more to the said Ben J. Pope and adjoining the lands of the late deceased John  
 & William Thomas and others also their heirs and their future assigns: Eight hundred & eighty  
 and three square measures twenty five rods of land and their future increase: To Have and  
 to hold to his the said Ben J. Pope proper use and behoof forever: Upon Covenant  
 Nevertheless that the said Ben J. Pope shall at the request of either one of the  
 parties aforesaid after giving at least two days notice of the time and place of sale  
 sell at public auction all the property aforesaid as so much thereof as will be  
 sufficient to satisfy the aforesaid debt of Two hundred & Eighty five dollars and that  
 the said Ben J. Pope and only of the parties first, pay the residue thereof then day etc.
