said Margaret Williams and Kate Williams whereby the said James S. Williams doth acknowledge
himself fully and amply satisfied, and paid and the said James S. Williams doth perform
his bond or assigns bargain and sell unto the said Margaret Williams and Kate Williams one
certain tract or parcel of land and premises lying and being in the County of Southampton
containing by Metes and Bounds thirty one acres more or less and bounded by the
boundaries of being the back of land formerly belonged to George Camp: To Have and
hold the aforesaid land together with all its appurtenances with securing the interest of
the Camp her life right, unto the said James S. Williams his heirs and assigns forever
and the said James S. Williams doth perform his bond or assigns forever
the aforesaid tract of land with all its appurtenances, and the aforesaid James
S. Williams doth by these presents warrant and forever defend all right title claim of

Southampton and State of Virginia. Witnesseth that the said Gutterb. D. Barham is the said
Carbam's land, George Broth's security to the said Ben & Esqr for Five hundred & eighty four dollars
due and not demanded the forth day of Feb^r 1743 and the said George Broth being
well and discreet & voluntary the said Gutterb. D. Barham against and left on said
Southampton. Now This Indenture Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the
sum of ten pounds and for the further consideration of one dollar to have the said George Broth in hand
paid by the said Ben & Esqr at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the
said George Broth except whereof is hereby acknowledged, that the said George Broth doth give grant
bargain and sell, and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell to the said
Ben & Esqr his heirs and assigns forever. One tract of land, on which the said George
Broth now resides together with the appurtenances thereto belonging containing Four hundred
& forty acres be the same more or less and securing the lands of five Women for father
& three Women and others also three houses and their future increase: Eight hundred & eighty
and their future increase twenty five heads of hogs and their future increase. To Have and
to hold to him the said Ben & Esqr proper use and behoof forever. Upon Condition
Nevertheless that the said Ben & Esqr shall at the request of either one of the
parties aforesaid after giving at least two days notice of the time and place of sale
sell at public auction all the foregoing aforesaid as so much thereof as will be
sufficient to satisfy the aforesaid bond of Five hundred & eighty four dollars and that
the said Ben & Esqr and only of the persons first pay the residue thereof then pay the
