Believe James Morris of the County of Sussex of the party first, and Samuel  
Kells of the County of Southampton of the second part, and Patrick W. Killings and  
Dwaine Bate of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the third part,  
and whereas the said James Morris stands justly indebted to the said Patrick W.  
Killings by bond bearing date the 15<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1833 for the sum of  
four hundred and thirty one dollars & 12 cents as also to the said Dwaine Bate  
by several bonds one bearing date the 25<sup>th</sup> day of November, 1829 for twenty five  
dollars & 50 cents and other bearing date the 26<sup>th</sup> August, 1829 for fourteen dollars & 1 cent  
also one account for three dollars & 75 cents and whereas the said James Morris being  
desires to secure and have agreed to secure the payment of the several debts and  
interest to the said Patrick W. Killings and Dwaine Bate their heirs or assigns  
with all charges standing the same or incurred by reason of the premises by
