Rochester shall fail to pay unto the said Edward Beale the debt aforesaid due him with interest, which may accrue thereon any part of the said debt due in interest when demanded, it shall and may be lawful for the said Bay & Wall or in case of his death for his legal personal representative who is hereby authorized to act, after being thereon required by the said Edward Beale his Executors administrators and assigns to make sale of the property aforesaid for cash having given at least ten days previous notice of the time and place and day of the same writing, therefrom forth, pay and satisfy the debt and interest aforesaid or so much as may be due at the time and the rest any expenses attending such sale and the conveyance and the balance of any pay over to the said John R. Rochester his wife or legal personal representative half of the said John R. Rochester shall well and truly pay and discharge the debt aforesaid, an interest due thereon when demanded, the remainder is to be paid and enjoyed and of no effect, the Testimony whereof the said parties aforesaid have executed this their hands and seals the day and year first above written.

This Indenture made & concluded this 14 day of February 1845 between John Beale of the first party John R. Beale of the second party & James S. Williams of the third party whereas the said James S. Williams stands bound to the said John Beale in a bond due Anthony M. Howell for thirty three dollars, money owing from the date of said note and the said Beale being anxious to indemnify the said James S. Williams against any loss or damage of said suretyship hath agreed to convey the Williams lands formerly herein before mentioned unto the said John R. Beale in trust to be used for this purpose. Now therefore the said John Beale for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold by these presents done grant bargained sold unto the said John R. Beale his heirs and executors the following property to wit my lands known as Seven Acre, and his the said Beale unenclosed interest in certain lands of land lying & being in the County of Southampton which was the former land of my father Peter Beale whose name was Peter Beale and in which my Father Thomas Beale lies & left estate to Hower and to Hester the property is aforesaid also have the said John R.
