 to the said Manney in the sum of fifty dollars and being willing to secure the
 payment of the above named debt hereby agreed to convey the property herein after
 mentioned unto the said William S. Sackney to be sold for that purpose.
 Now therefore the said River Barber for and in consideration of the premises and
 of the further sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Wm. S. Sackney
 the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged has granted bargain and sold and by
 these presents has granted bargain and sold and convey unto the said Wm. S. Sackney his
 heirs the following property to wit: one Negro woman Sally. In Witness and to
 hold the premises properly hereinafter mentioned unto him the said Wm. S. Sackney
 his heirs &c. Witness the following Oath that of the said River Barber. Shall fail
 to pay the above debt due the said James & Manney when they become due
 it shall be the duty of the said Wm. S. Sackney when thereto required by the said
 Josiah Manney sell the above named slave and out of the proceeds of said sale first
 pay and discharge the expenses attending this deed then pay and satisfy the debt
 due the said James & Manney and the balance if any pay over to the said River
 Barber his heirs &c. now or hereafter and the said River Barber will covenant
 and defend this title to the aforesaid Negro slave unto the said Wm. S. Sackney
