to the said Manly in the sum of fifty dollars and being willing to secure their
payment of the above named sums hereto agreed to convey the property herein after
mentioned unto the said William S. Sontag to be sold for their purposes.

Now therefore the said River Barber for and in consideration of the promise and
of the further sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Wm. S. Sontag
has receipt thereof is hereby acknowledged has granted bargain and sold and by
these presents has granted bargain and sold unto the said Wm. S. Sontag the
herein the following property to wit: one Negro woman Sally the House and to
hold the same unto the said Wm. S. Sontag nevertheless Manly and Barber shall fail
to pay the aforesaid debt due the said James & Manly when they become due
it shall be the duty of the said Wm. S. Sontag when thereto required by the said
Elizabeth Manly sell the aforesaid slave and out of the proceeds of said sale first
pay and discharge the expenses attending this deed then pay and satisfy the debt
due the said James & Manly and the balance if any pay over to the said River
Barber he have hereafter or assigns and the said River Barber will covenant
and defend the title to the aforesaid Negro slave unto the said Wm. S. Sontag
