Witnesseth that the said James G Moore being bound to the said Joseph Lawrence on the  
sum of three hundred fifty dollar due by him bearing date the 28<sup>th</sup> March 1845  
Moore to secure the said Lawrence in the above sum of three hundred  
fifty dollars against all loss which he might sustain by securing the said property  
hereinafter mentioned unto the said John Williams in trust New Bedford this Eleventh  
Second - June - witnesseth that the said James G Moore for and in consideration of the premises  
as well as the further consideration of one dollar to him the said Moore in hand paid  
by the trustee at or before the date and delivery of this present the  
receipt of which is acknowledged hath granted bargained & sold and by this present  
deed grant bargained sold unto the said John Williams his heirs bear & assign  
the following property to ent one Negro man named Stephen (y) I bearing our last name  
Long Island born 17<sup>th</sup> day - number 2 - Body flat bottom chard I wash stand tables cracking  
ware I 6 shillings Drifts of corn fodder from pasture to Hove and Helle the aforesaid  
personal property unto him the said John Williams his heirs and assigns forever upon  
strict & condition nevertheless that the aforesaid Moore shall be permitted to retain  
possession of the aforesaid property until default in payment of the above sum of money  
and in default of payment of the above sum of Money to the said Lawrence by the said  
Moore that it shall not fail to lawful for the said Williams upon being required in  
writing by the said Lawrence his heirs executors & after giving reasonable time in two  
or three public places in the neighborhood of the said Moore and the place of late exposure  
the above instruments forfeiting at full auction to the highest bidder for each aforesaid  
thereof as may be sufficient to pay the sum sum of three hundred fifty dollars secured  
and all cost and reasonable expenses attending the sale and the balance of my pay as in the  
said James G Moore his heirs & assigns same under our hands and seals the 25<sup>th</sup> day March 1845
