This Indenture made and executed the 23rd March 1845 Between James C. Moore
 of the 1st part John D. Williams of the 2^d part and Benjamin Lawrence of the 3^d part
 witnesseth that the said James C. Moore being bound to the said John D. Williams in the
 sum of three hundred fifty dollars due by bond bearing date the 20th March 1845
 and being desirous to secure the said Lawrence in the above sum of three hundred &
 fifty dollars against all his estate which he might sustain by securing the said property
 herein mentioned unto the said John D. Williams in trust for Benjamin Lawrence the said
 James C. Moore witnesseth that the said James C. Moore for and in consideration of the premises
 as well as the further consideration of one dollar to him the said Moore in hand paid
 by the said at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the
 receipt of which is acknowledged hath granted bargain sold and by these presents
 hath grant bargain sold unto the said John D. Williams his heirs & assigns forever
 the following property to wit one Negro man named Stephen his wife and her
 & her's furniture 1st day winter & 1st day spring below church 1 wash stand table cooking
 ware & 1 stand Crisp of corn 1 pair of corn 1 pair of potatoes 10 Hens and 10 Hens the above
 personal property unto him the said John D. Williams his heirs & assigns forever
 & his heirs & assigns forever. Nevertheless that the said Moore shall be permitted to retain
 possession of the above property until default of payment in the above sum of money
 and in default of payment of the above sum of money to the said Lawrence by the said
 Moore then it shall and may be lawful for the said Williams upon being required in
 writing by the said Lawrence his heirs executors & assigns to remove the same
 or two other place in the neighborhood of the said Moore and the place of sale of the
 above mentioned property at public auction to the highest bidder for cash or so much
 thereof as may be sufficient to pay the said sum of three hundred & fifty dollars interest
 and all cost and reasonable expenses standing the date and the balance of any sum due to the
 said James C. Moore his heirs & assigns then and there on or before the 25th day of March 1845
