 Justice Darden his heirs and assigns shall and will warrant and forever

 Lawrence by a certain indenture bearing date the 10th day of March in the year
 aforesaid did grant transfer and convey unto the said William O. Watson his heirs
 and assigns all that tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of
 Northampton and bounded by the lands of Allen Edwards on Black water Road
 and the land of Jonathan Johnson and by the said back water together with the
 appurtenances to the said land belonging in trust and with power and authority
 to the said William O. Watson his heirs and assigns to sell and dispose of the said
 land for certain purposes in the said deed expressed and whereas the said William
