This Plaintiff makes this 1<sup>st</sup> day of May 1845 before Samuel Brule  
of the first part and John M. Burley of the second part and Notary to  
Bryant of the 3<sup>rd</sup> part whereas the said Samuel Brule a freely incurred  
to N.B. Bryant the sum of one hundred and fifty one and 20/100 dollars  
lent him the 20<sup>th</sup> day of April last and the said Samuel Brule "I  
will and do now to have and take the said Samuel Brule" in  
consideration of our debt to the said Samuel Brule sum in hand by the  
said John M. Burley at and before the delivery of these presents the said  
a freely acknowledged by the said Samuel Brule hath given granted bargained  
and sold above expressed amount and confirmed by these presents doth release and confirm  
to the said John M. Burley his heirs and assigns forever all his present  
gaining cause of complaint, damages and penalties our baleines, but is not yet  
of ours or our cause and release and all other property owned by him not  
previously conveyed unto the said John M. Burley his heirs executors administrators and  
assigns forever to the only person or persons and behalf of the said John  
M. Burley his heirs executors to forever and the said Samuel Brule for  
himself his heirs or debts freely released former and agrees to and with  
the said John M. Burley his heirs is forever in manner and form following that  
it is so say that the said Samuel Brule has his heirs executors administrators and  
assigns forever the property hereby conveyed unto the said John M. Burley his heirs as  
against all persons whatever shall and will warrant and forever defend  
of these presents against whomsoever the aforesaid John M. Burley shall present  
the aforesaid Samuel Brule to hold the aforesaid property in his possession  
until default be made in the payment where in part or in the whole and  
then upon further trust to seal after the happening of such default of  
payment the said N.B. Bryant shall request seal of the aforesaid property  
for each and all of the money owing from such date that after satisfying  
the charges and expenses thereof pay to the said N.B. Bryant his executors  
admin or assigns the sum of one hundred and fifty one dollars and 20/100  
with interest thereon and the balance if any the residue shall pay to the  
said Samuel Brule his heirs or assigns but if the whole sum of one  
hundred and fifty one dollars and 20/100 and less be paid off in full  
that no default be made of payment this Indenture to be void or the remain  
in full force and virtue till 30th June or we do set our hands and affi
