This Indenture made and entered into the 28<sup>th</sup> day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty four between James Darrow of the town of Southold William C. Myrick of the town of Southold both and the same James Darrow by his wife Elizabeth all of the County of Southampton and State of New York whereas the said James Darrow is hereby indebted to the said Sarah Barnes by her husband bearing even date with this Indenture in the sum of two hundred and dollars and 25/100 and the said James Darrow being fully indebted to the said B. & E. Pope by him bearing even date with this Indenture in the sum of one hundred and twenty six dollars and 25/100 and the said James Darrow being willing and desirous to secure the aforesaid debt entirely and cast Now the Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and for the further consideration of me after to have the said James Darrow in hand paid by the said William C. Myrick at and before the date and delivery of these presents the aforesaid debt which is hereby acknowledged by the said James Darrow shall be given granted bargained and sold and by these presents debt give granted bargained and sold to the said William C. Myrick his heirs and assigns forever two tracts or parcels of land one of which is known by the name of (Vista place) supposed to contain one hundred and twenty four acres to the same more or less and adjoining the lands of the heirs of Lewis Howell who the original of said property to the said Jacob Barnes and Jonathan Butler other tract is the next adjacent to the said James Darrow has been supposed to contain one hundred and fifty acres by the same Lewis or his and adjoining the lands of Bennett Barnes Jacob Barnes and Daniel Barnes also his house and barns and their furniture consisting two houses of stone and their furniture moreover three large trees and their furniture consisting two houses of logs and their furniture moreover three stone and furniture two stone guns six sitting chairs two tables two chairs one spinning wheel one cart and four wheel all farming utensils with all their house hold and kitchen furniture etc horses and to sell to his the said William C.
