This Indenture made the 31st day of May 1845 Between Alexander Stearns
 of the first party Thomas Myrick of the second party & Joseph Stearns of the third
 party whereas the said Alexander Stearns a Justice intituled unto the said Joseph
 Myrick in the sum of thirty five dollars & twelve cents due by him bearing date
 with these presents and whereas the said Alexander Stearns a Justice to record
 and hath agreed to record the property of the aforesaid debt by removing the
 property hereinbefore mentioned unto the said Thomas Myrick in trust and to hold
 for that purpose. Now after Indenture whereof it is hereby acknowledged that the said Alexander Stearns for
 and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said
 Thomas Myrick the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged held judgment and sold and
 by these presents date given delayed and left unto the said Thomas Myrick the following
 property to wit all house building timber house of brick and masonry & land called
 a meadow or ridge near about two hundred two hundred feet and four hundred feet long
 a crop of corn greater part ripened in six or seven barrels of corn & one thousand pounds of
 fodder and we having forming about of one acre described unto the said Thomas Myrick to hold
 him by the above grant to hold the property above named unto the said Joseph
 Stearns Notwithstanding that the said Thomas Myrick shall as any time hereafter as
 the property of either one of the aforesaid parties shall sell the property above named
 after legal notice of the time and place date and day of the payment of one
 in the said place pay all expenses attending the same being satisfied that above
 names duly and the aforesaid Stearns & the balance of one half of one to the said
