This Indentured Trade and indenture made the 29th day of October 1845
between William Boatell of Bertford County in the state of North Carolina
of the one part and William J. Sobrell of the County of Southampton State of
Virginia of the other part. Whereas it is agreed between the said William Boatell for and
in consideration of the sum of twenty six dollars to him in hand paid by
the said William J. Sobrell at or before the execution and delivery of these
forements the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged he has granted bargained
and sold and by these forements doth grant bargain sell unto William J. Sobrell
a certain tract or parcel of land lying & being in the County of Southampton in the
State of Virginia containing by survey about acres to the sum more or less
as may be found attached to the said William Boatell as aforesaid of Benjamin
Boatell as the owner of the same belonging to the state of North Carolina
not and designated in this state of the number no A 3 all of which will fully
appear by reference to the Report of the commissioners made to the County Court of
Southampton at the November term 1844 &c he has and to hold the above mentioned
tract from a parcel of land and premises with its appurtenances unto him the said
William J. Sobrell his heirs and assigns forever And the said William Boatell hereby
covenants to and with the said William J. Sobrell his heirs &c that he will convey
& defend the premises hereby conveyed unto the said William J. Sobrell his heirs &c and
assigns against the claim of himself the said William Boatell his heirs &c and of all
other person or persons whatsoever. In testimony whereof the said William Boatell
has hereunto set his hand & affixed his seal the day & year first above written
witnessed & delivered.

And I do hereby certify and confirm and shall and will from time to time certify
and confirm all and whatsoever my said attorney shall require to do in cause to be done
