 as attorney in fact for Wm W Bishop and Peter Winsted Emily his wife the sum
 of fifty dollars to be equally divided between them

 them defend their due proportions of any debt or demands which may hereafter be
 recovered against the estate of the said John Bishop and the costs attending such
 recovery then the above obligation to be void or else to remain in full force

This Indenture made and entered into on this 10th day of September in the
 year 1848 by and between Augustus Piper first part Cook Warren second part and
 James Worrell third part all the parties here named in the County of Southampton in the
 State of Virginia This Indenture witnesseth that whereas the above named James Worrell
 has shewed himself as being due for the above named Augustus Piper for the payment of
 two hundred and twenty five dollars then and to be paid at three instalments to wit twenty
 five dollars due at or about the 1st day of Decr 1842 also for a like sum due at or
 about the 30th day of Decr 1843 also for a like sum due at or about the 30th day of
 Decr 1844 all of which sum is payable to George Worrell Quartermaster to Captain and
 Mary Powell also some for some of twenty five dollars and twenty five cents due and
 owing to September Powell and payable at interest the 28th day of December year 1845
 And therefore in order to indemnify the said James Worrell in the premises and in consideration
 of one dollar to have the said Augustus Piper we have paid by the said named Cook Warren
 at and before this writing and delivery of these presents the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged
 and formal receipt by the said Cook Warren is former receipt executed and discharged by the said
 Augustus Piper with twenty great bargons and sell unto him the said Cook Warren for him
 and assigns the following named property to wit one feather bed furniture one trunk two
 tables two one low one high one sofa one apple tree fourteen large highland five barrels
 two County Shells one cotton with three appearance two each one pair white sheepskin
