Filed Indenture made and entered into on this 17<sup>th</sup> day of September in the year 1848 by and between Augustus Pepe first party Sarah Barnes second party and James Worrell third party all the parties herein named in the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia This Indenture witnesseth that whereas the above named James Worrell has heretofore bound himself to the above named Augustus Pepe for the payment of one hundred and twenty five dollars due and to be paid at three instalments to wit twenty five dollars due at or about the 31<sup>st</sup> day of Decr 1848 also for a like sum due at or about the 31<sup>st</sup> day of Decr 1849 also for a like sum due at or about the 31<sup>st</sup> day of Decr 1850 all of which sum is payable to George Powell Esq. of Norfolk and Mary Powell also James for sum of twenty four dollars and twenty five cents due and owing to George Powell and myself as aforesaid the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of December year 1848 And therefore we enter to indenture the said James Worrell in the premises and as consideration of our said to bind the said Augustus Pepe as herein named by the above named Sarah Barnes at and before this entering and delivery of these presents the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged and from thence to the said Sarah Barnes to forever absolve exonerate and discharge in the sum of Augustus Pepe side twenty four dollars and still make him the said Sarah Barnes his heirs and afflato the following named property to wit one feather bed ornamented one French box tables two one long three legs one w<sup>th</sup> one apply mett furniture large lampstands four lamps two Country beds or vallets with their appurtenances less and to one pair white chenille
