in hand by George A. W. Newell of the County of Southampton have given quitclaim bargained
and sold and do by these presents give quitclaim and sell unto the said Newell
and his heirs forever certain tract of land lying in the County of Southampton
at Adelney river containing three hundred and four acres more or less adjoining the
lands of John James Esq. Miller and about being the same tract which was conveyed on
a deed of Deed executed by Samuel J. Jones to S.R. Edwards trustee for the benefit of
Sam J. Jones and purchased at a date under said deed by said Mills & Townsend in
shares and to hold in joint tenement of lands and all fortrees and appurtenances thereto
belonging unto the said George A. W. Newell and his heirs forever and the said Mills &
Townsend for himself & his heirs hereby covenants to enter with the said George A. W. Newell
and his heirs that the above described tract of land is free from all encumbrances
and that he has a legal right to convey the same in fee simple and that he will and
