granted bargained and sold all public auction and by these presents to bargain and sell
with the said Henry Williamson his heirs and assigns the said tract and its appurtenances also a
certain tract or parcel of land of several belonging to the estate of said Monmouth and containing
by abstract and hundred acres be the land now or late lying on the south side of and bet
ween and bounded as follows by the lands of George Smith and others To have and to
hold the said tract and parcel of land with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging
to the said Benjamin Williamson his heirs and assigns forever to the said Henry Moore and
heirs of him the said Benjamin Williamson his heirs and assigns forever and the said
Henry Moore Justice of the Peace affirmed debt further covenant and agree with the said
Benjamin Williamson his heirs and assigns and the said Henry Moore Justice of the Peace
shall and will warrant and force defend the above mentioned tract and land together with
the appurtenances unto the said Benjamin Williamson his heirs and assigns forever against
the claim or claims of all and every other person or persons whatsoever But Witnesseth
that the said Henry Moore Justice of the Peace affirmed both tenants set his hand and affixed his
