Myrech his master above named for ever & will witness whereof I have countersigned my hand and seal the 15 Nov<sup>r</sup> 1845

This Indenture made this 11<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year of our Lord  
one thousand eight hundred and forty five between Martha E. Brown of the one  
part & Joseph W. Whitcomb of the other part, all of the County of Isle of Wight,  
State of Virginia Notwithstanding that the said Martha E. Brown for and in consideration  
of the sum of forty eight dollars to her hand paid by the said Joseph W. Whitcomb  
the receipt whereof the said Martha E. Brown doth hereby acknowledge has granted  
bargained & sold by her present & grants to Joseph W. Whitcomb all the  
Whitcomb his land and all a certain tract of land containing by estimation  
thirty four acres to the same more or less lying and being in the County  
of Southampton being the land which the said Martha E. Brown inherited from her  
Mother William Lennard Esq. heretofore to Hold the same tract of land and all the  
buildings and appurtenances unto the said land belonging or in any wise appertaining  
to the said lot to Joseph Whitcomb his heirs & assigns forever unto the said Martha E. Brown  
the said land with the buildings and appurtenances appertaining unto the said lot to  
Joseph Whitcomb he has so first given the claim & amount of all and every sum or  
whatever shall well and truly appear in the account of Martha E. Brown above  
her hand and seal the day and year first above written
