for and in consideration of the sum of fifty five dollars to them lawfully paid by  
the said Commo Debit at the making and delivery of these presents the receipt of which  
is hereby acknowledged they the said Jacob Darden and Sally his wife in consideration  
as aforesaid have and do hereby bargain and sell unto her the said Commo Debit a certain  
lot or parcel of land lying in the aforesaid County of Southampton and bounded by the  
lands of George Wick and the lands formerly owned by James Williams for six and  
supposed to contain thirty three acres of land he the said Commo Debit do have and to  
hold the said lot and parcel of land with all the appurtenances to the said land  
belonging or in any way appertaining with all the right title interest and estate which
