part and W. M. Song of Halifax North Carolina John W. Patterson and John W.
Wells Merchants and partners in trade under the firm and style of Patterson & Wells
of Petersburg Va of the other part; Witnesseth that the said James Simmons and Marthe
his wife for and in consideration of the sum of ten hundred dollars to them in hand
paid by the said parties of the second part at & before the sealing and delivery of these
present the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted conveyed sold released
enjoyed confirmed and conveyed and by these presents do grant bargain sell release
confirm and convey unto the said parties of the second part and unto their heirs and assigns
forever all their unburdened interest in and to certain ten parcels or parcels of land situate lying
and being in the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia and containing six hundred
and twenty six acres The one tract first in parcel of land containing four hundred and twenty
seven acres situate the lands of Henry Leonard and others and is the land on which the
Cook has title and also formerly the property of Samuel Cook the other tract first in
parcel of land containing two hundred and the acres also situate the land of Henry Leonard
and others and is situate in the Stephens land together with all the estate right title interest
and property now and hereafter whosoever of them the said James Simmons and Marthe
his wife in law or equities or otherwise have or in to or out of the same Do hereby
will to hold these unburdened interest in the said ten parcels of land and every
part and parcel thereof with their appurtenances unto the said parties of the second part
their heirs and assigns forever and unto the only perfect use and behoof of them the said
