This Indenture made and entered into this the 1st day of January 1778 between
John Banks of the one party, William S. Williams of the second party, and Edward
Benton of the third party; witnesseth that whereas the said John Banks, formerly
inhabited unto the said Edward Benton on the sum of two hundred dollars due by him
to him on the 1st day of January 1746, and being and desirous to trust the property,
slaves, boats and all merchandise of one dollar to him on board freight by the said
William S. Williams, hancipated and told aboveunto enfranchised and confirmed, and by their
private debt grant language and still above enfranchised and confirmed unto the said William S.
Williams his heirs executors administrators and assigns the following property, namely first
barrels of long corn, three Hogs Head porter, six staves & blocks one set, one barrel and
one cask one half and foremores one double big kettle and kettle fifteen hundred pounds
dressed pork and all of my property not conveyed before his leave unto the said Edward Benton
property unto him the said William S. Williams his heirs executors and administrators for the
following time and purpose set to a day least of its term John Banks shall have for a day
unto the said Edward Benton the same aforesaid one hour with interval of which any sum
thereon or any part of the same fully and interest aboves demanded it shall not pay to himself
for the said William S. Williams or in case of his death for his legal personal representative who
hath authority to act upon being death assumed by the said Edward Benton to him
administrator a right to the property aforesaid for him being given prior to his
last day payment full title of the same and place and set of the same to him therefore
first day next dñe he shall and without payment to the said Edward Benton a day to have at
the time and the cost and expence attending said title and that everyone and the
balance of any sum or money to the said John Banks his wife a legal personal representative
but of the said John Banks shall not only pay and discharge the aforesaid
