Witnesseth that the said Thomas Wren and Margaret his wife in consideration of
Barham Five dollars and twenty cents lawful Money of this Commonwealth to them in
hand paid by the said Samuel Barham at or before the execution and delivery
of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and
sold and by these presents do and make of them unto Bargain and sell unto the said
Samuel Barham his heirs and assigns a certain tract of land containing
Twenty acres by the name More a field lying and being in the County of Southampton
on the south side of Old George Blas Hall road and bounded as follows (a w^t)
beginning at a pine at the Cuttawas branch in Robert Rachels line thence west
along the said Rachels line to a post in Samuel Barhams line thence along the said
Barhams line to a rock oak corner in the deer land of Mr. Ann & Rachels
relict of William & Rachels late slaves along a line of Skipper trees to a rock
in said deer slaves North by E^{ast} by a line of chestnut trees in said deer land to
Old George Blas Hall road thence east along the various meanders of said
Hall road to the mouth of the Cuttawas branch thence south up the said
branch to the commencement of More and to More the said tract a parcel
