 a bond executed to Charles Griffin for the sum of eighty four dollars and eleven
 cents the said Wm B. Shanks being willing and desirous to secure and save himself the said Inman
 against any claim which he might sustain by the aforesaid bond. Now therefore
 this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises so well as for
 the further consideration of one dollar to have in hand paid by the said Wm B. Shanks
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged both granted bargained sold and conveyed
 and by these presents the great bargain and exchange made the said Wm B. Shanks
 in trust for that purpose the following property to wit one bay horse a buggy 3 head
 of cattle and mares and 12 hogs and mares are but subject all say farming utensils and
 some held and helden furniture upon trust to wit that the said Wm B. Shanks
 shall at any time hereafter when being requested by either of the aforesaid parties shall
 sell the aforesaid property for cash after advertising the time and place of sale and out
 of the proceeds of such sale first pay and satisfy all expenses attending the said then
 pay the above named debt for which the said Inman is jointly and the singular of
 any pay are to the said Griffin his heirs assigns and the said Griffin hereby
 covenants to the said Shanks that he is possessed of an absolute for simple right in
