 for and on consideration of the sum of fifty six dollars to them so handed over by the said
 Howell S. Rutledge at and before the making and signing of these presents the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargain and sold with and by these presents doth
 grant bargain and sell with and confirm unto the said Howell S. Rutledge his heirs and assigns
 forever a certain lot or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing
 by estimation twenty acres or more more or less and bounded by the tract known and called
 S. Rutledge and Son & Walter it here and to hold the before granted land and premises
 with all and singular the appurtenances thereto in anywise appertaining unto the
 said Howell S. Rutledge his heirs and assigns forever unto the said Thomas Rutledge
 and F. S. his wife against the right and title to the before granted land and premises to
 the said Howell S. Rutledge his heirs and assigns against the claim of the said Thomas Rutledge
 and F. S. his wife and their heirs and against the claim or claim of all and any other persons
 whatsoever shall well and lawfully demand and forever defend by these presents Well Witnesseth
 the said Ed. Rutledge and F. S. his wife against lawful demands and their heirs and
 assigns their words the day and year first above written
