Bill of Exchange made and delivered unto me the 2^d day of April in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and forty six between Southampton Clerk of the court post office and the
second post and Sepulchre & Smith of the third post all of the County of Southampton and
State of Virginia whereas the said Sepulchre & Smith being indebted to said Plaintiff
by their notes or bank of fifty three dollars thirty three and one half hours bearing date on the
day of January last foregoing annually the sum to be paid of the sum of one hundred
and one and one half dollars being seven shillings to said John C. Smith the said
Sepulchre & Smith being without and unable to have himself the said Sepulchre & Smith his
debtors and tenancy to have damages about the sum of one hundred and twenty five dollars for each and
to the full construction of the former not also for the further construction of the sum of one dollar a head
Accrued damages and Sepulchre & Smith in bond paid by the said James Morris at and before the
Brought of yesterday and attorney of these presents the sum of which is hereby acknowledged to be due
the said Sepulchre & Smith hath granted judgment and doth ent by these presents take grant
the said Plaintiff and all who shall the said James Morris his heirs Executors administrators and assigns
forfeite the following property to each and every head as by law hereof law head cattle and their
increas one note above forty four dollars and there over and twenty head sheep and increased
one till Blacksmith two four hams and two four rash which were right plough box
there with plough gear for further note judgment one note 2 hams and 10 bushels wheat
half a acre clover half a acre vetches 1000 feet stalks and fence one spider
one pig and one calf and Law Head South Wessell that the said James Morris his heirs
Executors administrators and assigns shall permit the said Sepulchre & Smith to remain on part and
possess property of the aforesaid property hereby granted and intended to be emerged until
definitely to make in the payment of the aforesaid sum a sum not the interest thereon owing
also in the whole or in part to said John Bradford his heirs or assigns and that upon the
further sum that the said James Morris his heirs Executors administrators and assigns shall make
to said after the happening of such sum and as they may think proper sufficient and still
at full and clear all the aforesaid property hereby granted after paying of such and any further
value of the time and place of such date by them a sum aforesaid paid up of public money
on the high highway of said property and all of the proceeds of such sale first pay and satisfy
all the costs and charges attending thereon and then pay to said John Bradford his heirs
and assigns the amount a sum that in the value of said property is one hundred and
forty four dollars and one hundred and one dollars and the receipt of any sum so to said Sepulchre
& Smith to enter a receipt by the whole of said sum into or book that he fully paid of and
discharged as the sum of said Bradford his heirs Executors administrators and assigns the sum on the 28th day
of December 1847 the second on the 25th day of December 1847 and the third on the 25th
day of December 1848 to that the effects of payment of the sum of one hundred and forty
four dollars and one hundred and one dollars shall be submitted to the court to examine in full force and violence
