This Plaintiff made the 28th day of May in the year 1858 by and between
William S. Barber, trustee of the first part and S.A. W. Brown of the second party
late of the County of Suffolk whereas by date bearing date March 28 1853 and
Received January 28 1854 I sold to George formerly of the said County, conveyed to
Elmer G. Barber as trustee his interest in an undivided tract of land therein specified
and for certain purposes therein above specified which tract of land was afterwards
described under a decree returned at April Court 1853 and the same includes entries on the
said acts off and unclaimed being 400 acres located in the west by the lands of Joseph H.
Tighe on the south by the shore water to the east by the lands of Elmer Barber and W.
P. Barber and in the north by the lands of James & Peter and David Pittney being the same
part or tract of land conveyed by the said Thomas to Elmer G. Barber by date bearing date
July 15 1853 and of record and otherwise also in the year 1853 or 1854 the said George
interest conveyed in the tract of land above named was sold by the trustee aforesaid Elmer
according to the decree above and the said S.A. W. Brown because he purchase at the sum of
five hundred dollars and the said Elmer G. Barber having died without executing
a will to the said George the purchase of said tract the above named William S. Barber
was appointed trustee for that purpose by May Court 1854 Recd Sheriff that Plaintiff
will file that he did not consideration of the premises and for the further protection of the same
I am told or heard said by the said S.A. W. Brown she except above a truly acknowledged
the said William S. Barber has gone greatly changed and shall not die by these present goods
safeguards and still unto the said Brown and his heirs forever the aforesaid lands and described
part of land being the same Joseph H. Tighe's interest in the tract aforesaid will off and unclaimed
etc as aforesaid and particularly described and conveyed in the tract above named from S.A. W. Brown
to Elmer G. Barber bearing date May 28 1853 is held and to hold the said above named part
of land to him the said Brown and his heirs forever until the said William S. Barber for himself
and his heirs comes to sue with the said Brown and he has that he will forego exec and
defeat the said above named part of land to him the said Brown and his heirs against the legal
claims and demands of himself and all others claiming from him through him but against the
claims of no other person or person whatever else aforesaid above the said William S. Barber holds
off his hands and the day and year before named
