This Indenture made this 15<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty six between Christopher Witheyford of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Sarah Lovell of the said County & State of the other part Witheyford shall the said Sarah Lovell have for ever in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars paid her by said present date given her by  
and for ever come unto the said Christopher Witheyford his heirs and assigns the following tract or parcel of land wherein it now exists containing by estimation four acres of land to the said Sarah Lovell and bounded as follows to westerly on the west side by the said land owned by H D Ward formerly owned by Capt Stephen and known as the Popham land on the back by the land now owned by Christopher Witheyford a before former land west as the back side a north west which is a corner from thence a due  
line running southerly & back to a road to which has other boundaries due or  
back up and from thence a line running back west thence to a drift pine tree on the  
dark side and from thence to the back end the line to a large stone stand off  
tree which stands a high point in the said field whereof a road leading  
southerly south and west crosses to a ditch present here been where stone etc far  
from the course of the line from the house of the said Sarah Lovell late former owner  
and defend all rights unto her against every party whatsoever against me past and  
future always with all the rights and appurtenances thereunto unto the said Christopher  
Witheyford his heirs and assigns forever. At witness whereof I have set my hand & affixed

This Indenture made this 4<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty six between George W. Petty of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Sam'l. Denby of the said County and  
State of the other part Witheyford shall the said George W. Petty for and in consideration  
of the sum of one hundred dollars received by him of the state of Virginia to have in  
hand past the receipt whereof a yearly acknowledgement shall give her  
and for this present his said George W. Petty and shall unto the said Sam'l. Denby his heirs  
and assigns forever all right title and claim that he the said George W. Petty hath  
or may have to the following slave named "Mollie" a female colored woman about  
fifty years old belonging to the said George W. Petty and known as Mrs. Alice  
Lady or Auntie Alice Rose and Denby with this further condition which said Mollie  
shall for life by his master Henry Petty under a seal and the will of his said master  
Henry Petty of the County of Essex Witheyford his hand and seal the day and date  
first above written.
