

651 This Indenture made the 23 day of May 1748 between William Shenton and Rebecca his wife of the County of Salop of the one part, and Richard & Thomas of the said County of the other part, Witnesses that the said William Shenton and Rebecca his wife in consideration of the sum of five hundred pounds to them well paid by the said Richard & Thomas do hereby acknowledge and declare of their parents the marriage whereby a hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by their parents do and each of them, sole bargain and sell unto the said Richard & Thomas his heirs and assigns a certain tench a parcel of land lying and being in the County of Lancashire containing by estimation six hundred and twenty six and bounded by the lands of Thomas & Christopher Rigby Tenants With Messrs and others do being the same tench of land whereof Stephen Handsworth late of the County of Lancashire died seignior and proprietor with all and singular the appurtenances therunto belonging a or any one appertaining do hereby declare to hold the said tench a parcel of land with its appurtenances unto the said Richard & Thomas his heirs and assigns forever and the said William Shenton and Rebecca his wife for themselves and their heirs the said tench a parcel of land with its appurtenances unto the said Richard & Thomas his heirs and assigns first from the death a release of them the said William Shenton and Rebecca his wife or either of them there a release of their heirs out of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall well not be awarded and force defend by their parents the Messrs whereby the said William Shenton and Rebecca his wife have received out their hands and seals the day and year first above written
