in 1700 by said town in the 3rd day of May 1700 with all and singular
the appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any way appertaining. We have caused to be held
the said lands a part of land with the appurtenances unto the said William Shorlock
his heirs and assigns first and last the said William E. Shorlock for twenty and ten
the said lands a part of land with its appurtenances unto the said William Shorlock
his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claim of him the said Richard E. Shorlock
and his heirs of all and every person a person abiding there shall well and truly know
and further bind by these presents \$100 Mils whereof the said Richard E. Shorlock
 hath promised to him and agreed to me the day and year first above written
in consideration and delivered.
