Head & Head just to the Second tract containing one hundred and thirty acres more or less including all singular the appurtenances and the corners and boundaries whatsoever next adjoins or borders on and other rents, issues and profits thereof and my just and general share of the same and to hold the said parcel of land with the tenement hereditaments and all and singular other the former hereditaments mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and may just and fairly stand with each of their right boundaries and appurtenances unto the said William H. Holmes his heirs and assigns forever and the said Robert S. Williams and Wm. and his wife for themselves and their heirs the said tract of land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before described and the said William H. Holmes his heirs and assigns forever to have and to claim as their the said tract of land and the said Wm. and his wife or either of them have a right of their heirs and of all and every person or persons whatever shall well and truly award
