This INDENTURE made this 17th day of October in the year 1848
between Robert Spring and Margaret his wife of the one party and Edmund Gray
of the other part all of the County of Suffolk and State of Virginia for and in consideration
of the sum of One hundred and forty eight dollars and fifty cents Virginia currency
to stand in trust paid the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged that the said
Robert Spring and Margaret his wife have bargained and sold and by their present
deed and sale of their said house and lot unto the said Edmund Gray his
heirs and assigns or certain tract or parcel of Land lying in the County of Suffolk
aforesaid containing by recent survey forty four and one half acres to the westward
of the said house and bounded as follows to wit On the North by the Lands of Peter Clark
east by those of William Spring to South by the said house cutting the road
here sold front the lands of Peter Spring and West by the track formerly known
as the Long road, but now owned by Archibald Johnson and Edmund Weller together
with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever lying
and being in and upon said property and every part and parcel thereof its heirs
and executors and administrators and successors and all and singular other the premises
and all and singular other the hereditaments and appurtenances hereinbefore mentioned
or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with
the sum of four hundred and twenty dollars and five cents to be paid
for and upon the said land or tract of land the said Robert Spring and Margaret his wife for
themselves and their heirs the said land with all and singular the appurtenances
and premises before mentioned unto the said Edmund Gray his heirs and assigns
free from all claim or charge of them the said Robert Spring and Margaret his wife
and of either of their heirs and of all and every person whatsoever shall
well and truly warrant and forever defend by deed patents the said property to the said
Robert Spring and Margaret his wife hereinafter to have and to hold
and to affix thereto the sign and good seal above written
